In an effort to reduce face-to face contact, the Chautauqua County Department of HHS is encouraging all Social Services clients to not come in for scheduled appointments or nonemergency services. Negative actions will not be taken on the case as a result of missing an appointment. The Department of Health and Human Services is committed to continue to serve the public, while balancing the health and safety of the community. Temporary Assistance, SNAP

All Public Assistance eligibility, recertification, and emergency interviews can be done by phone. Domestic Violence and Drug/Alcohol Screenings will be done by phone. These interviews can be conducted without face-to-face contact through 4/11/20 and recertification interviews can be conducted by phone through 5/15/20. All applications and required documents can be mailed, e-mailed, faxed, scanned, or dropped off. SNAP benefits can be applied for on-line at mybenefits.gov.

Temporary Housing Assistance (Homeless) and Non-PA Emergency Assistance applications and documentation can be mailed, e-mailed, faxed, scanned, or dropped off.

Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) provides payment to workers not traditionally eligible for unemployment benefits (self-employed, independent contractors, workers with limited work history, and others) who are unable to work as a direct result of the coronavirus public health emergency.
